## TRIVIATEST

1.	Aft	A. Longitudinal structure along centerline of ship bottom
2.	Bilge	B. Lowest point of a ship's inner hull where water collects
3.	Bulkhead	C. Right-hand side of a ship when looking forward
4.	Keel	D. Unit of measure for water depth or rope length, equals 6' or 1.83 m
5.	Starboard	E. Disturbed water left behind the boat as it moves through the water
6.	Bridge	F. To fasten a rope around a cleat using a figure-8 knot
7.	Course	G. Upright partition separating compartments in the hull of a ship
8.	Dry Dock	H. Raised borders on cabin tables which keep items from falling off
9.	Ballast	I. Iron or lead weights fixed in low-access area of a ship for stability
10.	Schooner	J. Flat-bottomed boat used for coastal transport of heavy loads
11.	Barge	K. Jail cell on a ship, used if cabin arrest is insufficient
12.	Fathom	L. Small boat used to transport people/supplies between ship & shore
13.	Brig	M. Command center from which the captain navigates the ship
14.	Land Lubber	N. The direction (in degrees) in which a ship is being steered
15.	Belay	O. A person who is unfamiliar with the workings of a seafaring vessel
16.	Fiddle	P. In a direction away from the wind
17.	Lanyard	Q. The front of a ship
18.	Port	R. Short length of line attached to something you don't want to lose
19.	List	S. A vessel's leaning to one side due to improper weight distribution
20.	Sloop	T. Left-hand side of a vessel when looking forward
21.	Wake	U. A vessel with >1 mast whose foremast is smaller than the main mast
22.	Galley	V. Upright metal post bolted to the deck to support guard railing
23.	Bow	W. Toward the stern or rear of a ship
24.	Stanchion	X. Ship's kitchen
25.	Leeward	Y. Boat with a single-mast design for one headsail and one mainsail
26.	Tender	Z. Can be filled with water after construction is complete or emptied of water after a ship is tugged in for repairs
